A Positive School Climate

We live in a world where raising children seems to have become increasingly complicated. Over time, schools have remained a symbol of stability and community that rises above the challenges we face in raising children. In order to ensure the success of our children, we must take active steps to embrace, cultivate, and develop home-school partnerships. Evidence shows a strong connection between parent and family involvement in schools and children's academic achievement, attendance, attitude, and continued education. However, families may not become involved if they do not feel that the school climate—the social and educational atmosphere of a school—is one that makes families feel welcomed, respected, trusted, heard, and needed.

A positive school climate exists when all students feel comfortable, wanted, valued, accepted, and secure in an environment where they can interact with

caring people they trust. A positive school climate affects everyone associated with the school—students, staff, parents, and the commu-

nity. It is the belief system or culture that underlies the day-to-day operation of a school.

At Woodlin we believe in the importance of parental involvement and encourage a wide range of opportunities for parents to become involved their child's education. All too often, parents assume that just sending their children to school and looking at their report cards is enough. Not true!



If you want to be involved, if you want to participate actively in the relationship

between your child and the school, there are some things you can do to make this relationship positive and productive.

Communicate with your child about school. This includes talking to him about his friends, activities, and teachers, and assignments.

Creating Better Students

Students are faced with more social, emotional, and behavioral issues than ever before and faced with mixed messages about how to behave in different situations. "Stop and Think" offers consistent methods for student to react to negative situations.

This program was developed by Dr. Howard Knoff, Professor of School Psychology, Univer-

sity of South Florida, and it is used in over 1,500 schools throughout the country including many Baltimore City Public Schools.

A focused topic is taught biweekly. The first topic "Listening" began on Sept. 10 at the town hall meeting.

Stop and Think Five Step Teaching Process

- ▼ Teaching the steps of the desired social skill.
- ▼ Modeling the steps and language of the social skill.
- ▼ Role playing the steps with students.
- ▼ Giving Performance Feedback as to how their doing with the new skill.

Woodlin Girl Scout Troops Accepting New Girls for 2007-2008

Our five Woodlin Girl Scout troops are accepting fall applications for new members. Our program at Woodlin is outstanding, with a great group of leaders. After 95 years, Scouting is still strong. It's a place where today's girls can become tomorrow's leaders. Membership in Girl Scouts is open to girls ages 5-17. Girls join for fun and friendship, but they also find out about building character and self-esteem and serving their communities—the core qualities of Girl Scouting. In Girl Scouts, girls find a safe place to grow and share new experiences, learn to relate to others, develop values, and contribute to society.

The Girl Scout program is based on the needs and interests of girls. Woodlin Girl Scouts are divided into: Daisy Girl Scouts (for kindergarteners and, as of fall 2008, K-1st grade); Brownie Girl Scouts (ages 6-8); and Junior Girl Scouts (ages 8-11).

Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis for girls new to Scouting. Due to an overwhelming increase in Brownie applications this year—and availability of parents who are able to volunteer as leaders for existing or new troops—we may run a slight waiting list for incoming Brownies. If that is so, we will get your daughter placed in a troop as soon as we have open-

ings. There are still openings in our Daisy and Junior Girl Scout troops.

BECOME A JUNIOR GREAT BOOKS VOLUNTEER

Would you like to be trained to help kids in Woodlin's classrooms with their reading and critical thinking? Once trained, parents will lead book discussion groups with advanced readers in grades 3-5—over 50% of the Woodlin students in those grades—using the Junior Great Books materials (and possibly 2nd grade).

Woodlin's Jr. Great Books program is supported by the Woodlin PTA, and is led by a parents like you. The program is fully supported by the school, takes place during regular school hours, and allows parents active participation in the students' core curriculum. We need additional volunteers.

Volunteers must attend a training session. The PTA will cover the costs for a limited number of parents (although volunteers are welcome to make a donation to defer to costs). Training is available in Rockville on 9/25-26; 10/11-12, or 11/27 -28 from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. There are two-day workshops, but parents can attend both days or only the first day. Parent volunteers also must commit to lead **at least one, six** weekly sessions. Sessions are approximately 45 minutes to an hour.

Shopping for Fun and Purpose

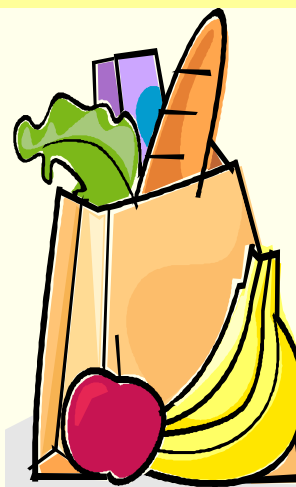
Sniders is a huge supporter of Woodlin through its receipt program. Parents or kids can drop off their Snider's market receipts in the receipt box that is in the mailroom. The box will be checked about every two weeks. A percentage of the total amount is paid to Woodlin. Last year's receipts total netted the school \$3,000.

In order for us to receive the monies, the receipts have to be in good shape and readable. Sniders receipts can be wrinkled but can't have any watermarks, food, or other things on them; they can't have torn off parts; and they

can't be faded. All the items must be very readable on the receipts. The receipts have to be submitted by the end of January 2008; after that time the 2008 receipts will be collected.

The Stop & Think Process for Teaching Social Skills (Language of the Program)



▼ "Stop & Think"-Gives students time to calm down and think about how to handle the situation.

▼ "Are you going to make a good choice or a bad choice?"-Student decides. Teacher also lets student know what a good and bad choice is.

▼ "What are your choices and steps?"-Helps students develop a plan for performing the social skill.

▼ "Do it!"-Completed when student actually carries out their steps or choices.

▼ "Good Job!"-Students positively reinforce themselves.
